

**The compilation of national accounts in a country in crisis: overview of the INS Côte d'Ivoire**

- On December 24, 1999: the regime of President Henri Konan BEDIE was overthrown. On September 19, 2002, an attempted coup d'état aborted and turned into a rebellion. The country was divided in two parts, between the north and south. The Ouagadougou Agreement of April 2007 shared the power between the rebellion, the presidential camp and the opposition and provide for free and transparent elections without exclusion.

The running of the National Institute of Statistics has of course been affected by this crisis. During the period November 1999 to May 2002, four General Directors followed each other at the head of the Institute in favor of regime change.

The national statistical information is also affected by the country's political and administrative partition and the worsening of some cross-border trafficking.

Despite its relatively small size, the division of the National Accounts strives to meet the calendar of compilation and dissemination of National Accounts (1 year delay for the provisionnal, 2 years for the definitive).
