The sharp increase in R&D subsidies to small firms between 2003 and 2010 has had a positive and growing impact on the employment of highly qualified workers. Descriptive statistics show that public support has a significant effect on the five-year survival rate of firms set up by unemployed people. However, once taken into account the effect of selecting the unemployed people best suited to creating a firm, this effect is most often zero. *Dominique Redor*

49 High turnover among nursing staff in private nursing homes for dependent elderly people in France: impact of the local environment and the wage

High turnover among nurses and nursing auxiliaries at private nursing homes for elderly dependent people, often related to environmental factors around employees' place of residence, has a negative effect on the quality of care for residents. It could be lowered by increasing the staff-to-resident ratio and nursing auxiliary wages. *Cécile Martin et Mélina Ramos-Gorand*

67 Does women's employment growth increase wage inequalities between couples? The case of France between 1982 and 2014

Contrary to popular belief, the rise in women's employment rate has not led to an increase in wage inequalities between French couples; on the whole, these inequalities remained stable between 1982 and 2014 among couples aged 30 to 59. *Milan Bouchet-Valat*

87 How long do situations of single parenthood last? An estimation based on French data

An original model is proposed to estimate, for the first time in France, the duration of single parenthood. Half of single parents with one or more minor dependent children remain in this situation three years; single parenthood duration is shorter for those who are separated than for those who had a child when not living with a partner.
