Stability in the unemployment rate in Q3 2010

The unemployment rate


The unemployment rate is stable in Q3 2010

In Q3 2010, the average ILO unemployment rate in metropolitan France and overseas departments stood at 9.7% of the active population.

In metropolitan France only, 9.3% of the active population was unemployed, i.e. 2.6 million people. It is stable compared to Q2 2010.

More generally, in metropolitan France, 3.4 million people did not work but would like to work, whether they are available or not for work within two weeks, or whether they look actively for a job or not (see additional indicators on the internet).



ILO employment and activity

The employment rate of the population aged 15-64 years was stable at 63.8% in Q3 2010. This stability the results from a decline in the permanent contract and stability in the temporary contract: the proportion of temporary contract in the population aged 15 64 years increased at 6.6%, while the proportion of permanent contract in the same age group decreased at 48.8%.

The **full time equivalent employment rate** is inferior by 4 points to the employment rate: it stood at 59.4% on average in Q3 2010.

The activity rate of the 15-64 years was 70.3%.

Underemployment decreased in Q3 2010

On Q3 2010, 5.6% of the persons employed are **underemployed**. The decrease, -0.1 point, is due to the decline of the slack work, which goes from 0.5% of the employed down to 0.4% in the second quarter, similar to the rates before 2008. The **unwanted part-time** was stable at 5.2% of the employed (see additional indicators on the internet).

Revision

The ILO unemployment rate of Q2 2010 is not revised compared to the temporary publication of September 2010.

A more precise estimate

In order to improve the precision of the data on the labor market, INSEE gradually increased the size of the sample of the Labour Force Survey since the first quarter of 2009. The operation ended with the publication of Q2 2010 results; the size of the sample has been increased by 50%. Consequently, the estimate of the quarterly unemployment rate is more precise (+/-0.3 point against +/- 0.4 point before the increase of the sample). The estimate of the variation is also more precise, but within the limits of the rounding (+/-0,3 point).

More:

- An unemployed person for the International Labour Office (ILO) is a person in age to work (15 years or more) who did not work, even one hour, during the reference week, who is available to work within two weeks and who looked actively for a job in the previous month (or has found an employment which begins in three months). The part of the unemployed persons within the total population differs and is lower than the unemployment rate, which is the ratio between the number of unemployed people and the number of active people (employment + unemployment).
- The employment rate is the ratio between employed people and the total population. The full-time employment rate (or part-time employment rate) is the ratio between full-time (or part-time) employed people and the total population The full time equivalent employment rate is the ratio between the number of jobs converted into full-time and the total population. The core employment rate is the arithmetic average of employment rates by age detail. It permises to erase the demographic weight of mixed age groups.
- The **activity rate** is the ratio between active people (employed + unemployed) and the total population. The **active life expectancy** represents the average duration of activity in years of a fictitious generation subject to the conditions of activity of the period. It is independent of demographic structure.
- The underemployment for the ILO covers the persons who have a part-time job, who wish to work more hours during the reference week, and who are available to do it, wether they are looking for a job or not (unwanted part-time). Are also included in the underemployment the persons having involuntarily worked less than usually (slack work).
