

ILO unemployment rate and labour market indicators: results of the Labour Force Survey in Q3 2012

New unemployment rate increase in Q3 2012

• Unemployment rate

The unemployment rate increased by 0.1 point in Q3 2012 in metropolitan France

In Q3 2012, the average **ILO unemployment rate** in metropolitan France and overseas departments stood at 10.3% of the active population.

In **metropolitan France** only, with 2.8 million unemployed people, 9.9% of the active population was unemployed. The unemployment rate increased by 0.1 point q-o-q after an increase of 0.2 in Q2 2012.

More generally, in metropolitan France, 3.6 million people did not work but **would like to work**, whether they are available or not for work within two weeks, or whether they look actively for a job or not (see additional indicators on the internet).

ILO employment and activity

The **employment rate** of the population aged 15-64 years was steady in Q3 2012 and stood at 63.9%.

This rise comes from the employment rate rise in the population aged 50-64 years, more often in permanent contracts.

More:

- An **unemployed person for the International Labour Office** (ILO) is a person in age to work (15 years or more) who did not work, even one hour, during the reference week, who is available to work within two weeks and who looked actively for a job in the previous month (or has found an employment which begins in three months). The **part of the unemployed persons within the total population** differs and is lower than the **unemployment rate**, which is the ratio between the number of unemployed people and the number of active people (employment + unemployment).

- The employment rate is the ratio between employed people and the total population. The full-time employment rate (or parttime employment rate) is the ratio between full-time (or part-time) employed people and the total population. The full time equivalent employment rate is the ratio between the number of jobs converted into full-time and the total population. The core employment rate is the arithmetic average of employment rates by age detail. It permit to erase the demographic weight of mixed age groups.

- The activity rate is the ratio between active people (employed + unemployed) and the total population. The active life expectancy represents the average duration of activity in years of a fictitious generation subject to the conditions of activity of the period. It is independent of demographic structure.

- The **underemployment for the ILO** covers the persons who have a part-time job, who wish to work more hours during the reference week, and who are available to do it, whether they are looking for a job or not (**unwanted part-time**). Are also included in the underemployment the persons having involuntarily worked less than usually (slack work).

Temporary contracts slightly decreased by 0.1 point and stood at 6.6%.

The **full time equivalent employment rate** was lower by 4 points than the employment rate: it stood at 59.5% on average in Q3 2012.

The **activity rate** of the 15-64 years increased by 0.3 point, at 71.0%.

Slight decrease in underemployment

In Q3 2012, 5.1% of the persons employed were **un-deremployed**, falling by 0.3 point. Slack work slightly decreased at 0.3%.

The **unwanted part-time** was 4.8% of the employed (see additional indicators on the internet).
