Turnover in industry and construction – September 2015

In September 2015, the turnover rebounded in the manufacturing industry (+0.5%)

Every index in this issue is in value (tax excluded), seasonally and working day adjusted. The commentary shows variations of subsections by decreasing contribution. The contribution of a subsection depends on the extent of the change and on its weight.

In September 2015, the turnover bounced back in the *manufacturing industry* (+0.5%, after –0.4% in August). However, exports fell back (–1.4%, after +1.5%).

In the *industry as a whole*, the turnover recovered as well (+0.4%, after -0.2%).

Near stability over the third quarter (-0.1%)

Over the third quarter of 2015, the turnover remained virtually stable in the *manufacturing industry* (–0.1%), and stable in the *industry* as a whole, compared to the second quarter.

Over this third quarter, the turnover grew substantially in the *manufacture of food products and beverages* (+1.3%). It rose slightly in the *electrical and electronic equipment, and machine equipment* (+0.2%). On the other hand, it dropped sharply in the *manufacture of coke and refined petroleum products* (-4.1%) and, more moderately, in the *manufacture of transport equipment* (-0.9%). It levelled off in *other manufacturing* (-0.1%).

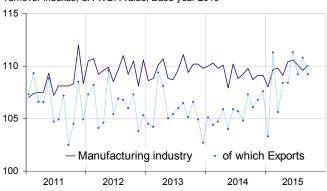
Increase compared to last year (+0.6%)

The turnover in the *manufacturing industry* went up by +0.6% over the third quarter of 2015, compared to the same quarter of the previous year.

Over this period, the turnover rocketed in the *manufacture* of transport equipment (+8.7%). It also went up in the manufacture of food products and beverages (+1.4%) and more moderately in the electrical and electronic equipment, and machine equipment (+0.7%). Conversely, it slumped in the manufacture of coke and refined petroleum products (-17.9%) owing to a fall in prices, and it decreased slightly in other manufacturing (-0.4%).

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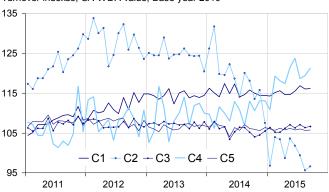

Further rise in transport equipment (+1.6%)

In September, the turnover grew for the second month in a row in the *manufacture of transport equipment* (+1.6%, after +0.6% in August). This rise was due both to the *manufacture of motor vehicles, trailers and semi-trailers* (+2.3%) and to the *manufacture of other transport equipment* (+1.3%). Nevertheless, exports dropped sharply (-4.3%, after +9.8%).

Rebound in coke and refined petroleum products (+1.0%)

In September, the turnover bounced back in the *manufacture of coke and refined petroleum products* (+1.0%), after a decline for three months in a row.

Virtual stability in other manufacturing (+0.1%)

The turnover remained almost unchanged in September in other manufacturing (+0.1%) after a slight fall in August (-0.3%). It rebounded sharply in the manufacture of chemicals and chemical products (+1.4%) and the manufacture of rubber and plastic products (+1.1%). On the contrary, it dropped back in the manufacture of basic pharmaceutical products and pharmaceutical preparations (-2.4%), the manufacture of basic metals and fabricated metal products (-0.6%) and the manufacture of wood and paper products (-0.8%).

Near stagnation in food products and beverages (+0.1%)

The turnover was virtually stable in September in the manufacture of food products and beverages (+0.1%)

Slight rebound in equipments (+0.3%)

The turnover in the *electrical* and *electronic* equipment, and machine equipment rebounded slightly in September (+0.3%, after –0.7% in August). It rose in the manufacture of electrical equipment (+0.9%) and in the manufacture of computer, electronic and optical products (+0.2%). It levelled off in the manufacture of machinery and equipment n.e.c. .

• Revisions : +0.1 points in August in the manufacturing industry

In the *manufacturing industry*, the variation of the turnover in August 2015 has been revised upwards by 0.1 points, to –0.4%. In the *industry as a whole*, the variation in August 2015 has been confirmed at –0.2%.
