- ILO unemployment rate and labour market indicators: results of the Labour Force Survey in Q4 2014


The unemployment rate increased by 0.1 point in Q4 2014

Increase in unemployment in Q4 2014

In Q4 2014, the average ILO unemployment rate in metropolitan France and overseas departments stood at 10.4%, after 10.3% in Q3 2014. It returned back to its Q2 2013 level. In **metropolitan France** only, the number of unemployed has risen by 36,000; with 2.9 million people, 10.0% of the active population was unemployed. The unemployment rate increased by 0.1 percentage points q-o-q in metropolitan France. Over a year, it increased by 0.4 percentage points.

Among inactive people, 1.4 million wish to work but they are not considered as unemployed: they are part of the halo around unemployment. The number of people in this **unemployment halo** rose by 20,000 in Q4 2014, and by 78,000 over the year.

The employment rate and the activity rate increased slightly

The **employment rate** of the population aged 15-64 years stood at 64.2% in Q4 2014. It increased by 0.1 percentage points quarter-on-quarter, and remained stable year-on-year.

Permanent contracts employment rate increased by 0.2 percentage points in Q4 2014, at 49.1% of the population aged 15-64. Temporary contracts employment rate held steady, at 6.8%. The **activity rate** of people aged 15-64 stood at 71.4% in Q4 2014, increasing by 0.2 percentage points q-o-q, and by 0.3 percentage points y-o-y.

Underemployment concerns 6.5% of employed people

In Q4 2014, 6.5% of the employed persons were **underemployed**, increasing by 0.1 percentage points over the quarter. Slack work stood at 0.4% of the employed.

Revision

The ILO unemployment rate of Q3 2014 in metropolitan France remains unchanged, compared to the temporary publication of December 2014. It is revised down by 0.1 percentage points in France and overseas departments.

For more information:

- An **unemployed person for the International Labour Office** (ILO) is someone of working age (15 years or more) who did not work, even one hour, during the reference week, who is available to work within two weeks and who looked actively for a job in the previous month (or has found a job which begins in three months). The **proportion of unemployed people within the total population** differs and is lower than the **unemployment rate**, which is the ratio between the number of unemployed people and the number of active people (employment + unemployment).

- The **employment rate** is the ratio between employed people and the total population. The **permanent contract employment rate (resp. temporary contract)** is the ratio between people employed on permanent contracts (resp. temporary contracts) and the total population. The **full time equivalent employment rate** is the ratio between the number of jobs converted into full-time and the total population. The **core employment rate** is the arithmetic average of employment rates by age details. The demographic weight of mixed age groups can therefore be erased.

- The **activity rate** is the ratio between active people (employed + unemployed) and the total population. **Active life expectancy** represents the average duration of activity in years of a fictitious generation subject to the conditions of activity of the period. It is independent of demographic structure.

- The **unemployment halo** is composed of inactive people who seek a job but are not available, people who wish to work but don't seek a job, being available or not.

- **Underemployment for the ILO** covers the people who have a part-time job, who wish to work more hours during the reference week, and who are available to do so, whether they are looking for a job or not (**unwanted part-time**). Are also included in underemployment the people who have unintentionally worked less than usual (slack work).
