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Job creation in competitive sector - 2nd Quarter 2016

The increase in employment continued in Q2 2016

Warning: The introduction of the "Déclaration Sociale Nominative" (DSN) to replace the "bordereau récapitulatif des cotisations" (BRC) may affect transitorily the declarative behavior of businesses. During the ramp-up phase of the DSN, adjustments are made in the statistical processing chain of employment estimates to reflect these changes. These changes are likely to generate more revisions than usual to data.

Payroll employment increased again in the market

In Q2 2016, payroll employment in the non-farm market sectors continued to increase (+29,500 jobs, that is 0.2%, after +21,500 jobs in the previous quarter). The increase is due to employment excluding temporary work (+29,500 jobs, i.e. +0.2%, after +21,100 jobs in Q1 2016). Year-on-year, the principally market sectors created 121,300 jobs (+0.8%).

The industry and construction continued to destroy more jobs than they created

In Q2 2016, employment continued to decline in industry (-9,500 jobs, that is -0.3%, after -6,500 jobs, in Q1 2016). Similarly, in construction, net job destruction continued (-2,800, that is -0.2%, after -1,900 in the previous quarter. Year-on-year, industry lost 33,100 jobs (-1.1%) whereas construction shed 17,300 jobs (-1.3%).

Job creation accelerated in services, even as in temporary employment stabilised

Temporary employment stabilised for two quarters (stable in Q2 2016 after +400 jobs in Q1 2016). At the same time, employment in services excluding temporary work accelerated (+41,900 jobs, i.e. 0.4 %, after +29,500 in Q1 2016). Overall, the pace of job creation remained dynamic in the market services sector (+41,900 jobs, that is +0.4%, after +29,800 in the previous quarter). Year-on-year, temporary employment was very buoyant (+35,600 jobs, i.e. +6.5%) and the market services sector as a whole expanded by 171,800 jobs (+1.5%)


