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■ Turnover in industry and construction – April 2017

In April 2017, the turnover in the manufacturing industry fell back (-4.0%)

The commentary shows variations of subsections by decreasing contribution to the overall evolution. The contribution of a subsection depends on the extent of the change and on its weight.

In April 2017, the turnover fell back markedly in the manufacturing industry (-4.0%) after the sharp increase in the last month (+3.4%). The increase was stronger in export sales (-6.7% after +5.7%).

In industry as a whole, the turnover shrank sharply as well (-3.2% after +2.5%).

Increase over the first quarter (+1.3%)


Over the last three months, the turnover rose in the manufacturing industry (+1.3%) as well as in the industry as a whole (+1.8%). In the manufacturing industry the turnover rose in "other manufacturing" (+1.3%), in manufacture of food products and beverages (+1.2%), in manufacture of coke and refined petroleum products (+4.7%), in manufacture of transport equipment (+1.2%) and, more slightly, in machinery and equipment goods (+0.2%).

Significant growth compared to the previous year (+6.4%)

The turnover rose sharply from the same three months of the previous year in the manufacturing industry (+6.4%). The growth was still more marked in industry as a whole (+8.0%) as a result of the strong increase in mining and quarrying; energy; water supply; waste management (+15.8%). Over this period, the turnover rose in every main sector of the manufacturing industry: the manufacture of transport equipment (+12.5%), "other manufacturing" (+4.2%), the manufacture of coke and refined petroleum products (+27.6%), the manufacture of food products and beverages (+4.0%) and the machinery and equipment industry (+3.3%).

How to read it: in the manufacturing, the SA-WDA variation between February and March 2017 is revised by +0.37 point: +0.43 point are due to the raw series' revision and -0,06 to the new calculation of the SA-WDA parameters.

Fall in April in transport equipment (-12.7%)

In April, the turnover in the manufacture of transport equipment shrank strongly (-12.7%) after a sharp rise in March (+12.1%). This strong decrease is mainly due to the fall in manufacture of other transport equipment (-19.0% after +20.2%). The turnover in the manufacture of motor vehicles fell back again but to a lesser extent (-4.1% after +2.7%). The downturn was also strongly marked in export sales (-19.1% after +16.9%).

Sharp contraction in "other manufacturing" (-3.1%)

The turnover in "other manufacturing" dwindled in April (-3.1% after +2.7%). It fell back in particular in the manufacture of basic metals and fabricated metal products, except machinery and equipment (-5.3% after +4.3%), the manufacture of chemicals and chemicals products (-3.6% after +4.2%), the manufacture of rubber and plastics products, and other non-metallic mineral products (-3.7% after +2.5%) and the "other manufacturing" (-2.0% after +2.6%). In contrast it recovered in manufacture of basic pharmaceutical products and pharmaceutical preparations (+0.8% after -3.3%). The export sales fell back in "other manufacturing" as a whole (-2.3% after +2.2%).

Downturn in machinery and equipment (-2.1%)

The turnover in machinery and equipment fell back in April (-2.1% after +2.4%). It shrank mainly in the manufacture of computer, electronic and optical products (-4.2% after +2.4%) but also in the manufacture of machinery and equipment n.e.c. (-1.0% after +2.7%) and the manufacture of electrical equipment (-1.3% after +2.0%). Conversely, export sales was virtually stable (+0.1%).

Another decrease in coke and refined petroleum products (-0.6%)

In April, the turnover in the manufacture of coke and refined petroleum products fell again (-0.6% after -2.7% in March).

Virtual stability in food products and beverages (-0.1%)

The turnover remained virtually stable in the manufacture of food products and beverages (-0.1% after +0.1%) but export sales rose again (+0.6% after +2.1%).

Revisions

Compared to the previous estimation, the variation of March has been raised to +3.4% instead of +3.1% in the manufacturing industry, and to +2.5% instead of +2.2% in industry as a whole.
