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■ Turnover in large-scale food retailing - July 2017

In July 2017, the turnover grew in large-scale food retailing (+0.5%)

In July 2017, the turnover in large-scale food retailing accelerated (+0.5% after +0.1%). The sales bounced back in non-food products (+0.9% after -0.1% in June), while they slowed down in food products (+0.2% after +0.8%). Sales of automotive fuel were stable.

In July, sales in hypermarkets recovered (+0.6% after -0.1%), whereas they edged down in supermarkets (-0.2% after +0.4%).

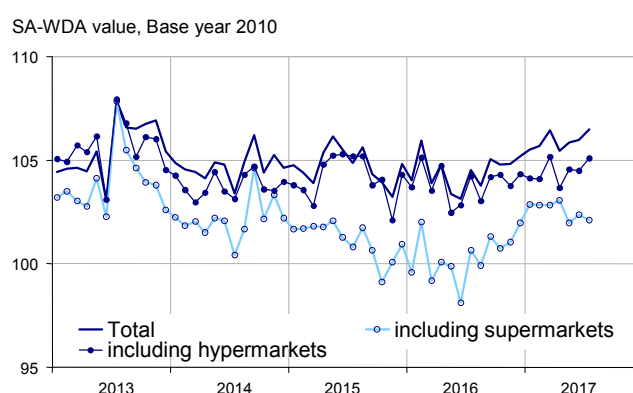
Slight increase over the last three months

Over the last three months, the turnover in large-scale food retailing increased slightly (+0.2%) compared to the previous three months. Over that period, sales went up sharply in non-food products (+1.9%) and more moderately in food products (+0.3%). By contrast, they slumped in automotive fuel (-4.3%). Sales in hypermarkets rose slightly (+0.4%), whereas they decreased in supermarkets (-0.7%).

Growth of 2.3% over a year

The turnover of the past three months in large-scale food retailing rose by 2.3% compared to the same period a year earlier. Sales grew in non-food products (+1.4%) as in food products (+0.8%). Sales of automotive fuel surged (+6.0%), boosted by the upturn in fuel prices. Year on year, sales increased markedly in supermarkets (+2.6%) as in hypermarkets (+1.5%).

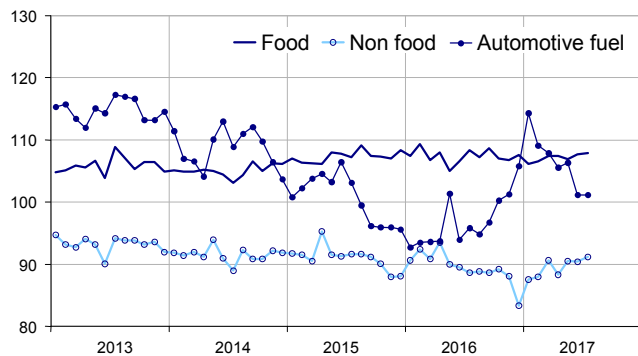

Turnover in super. and hypermarkets by type of products

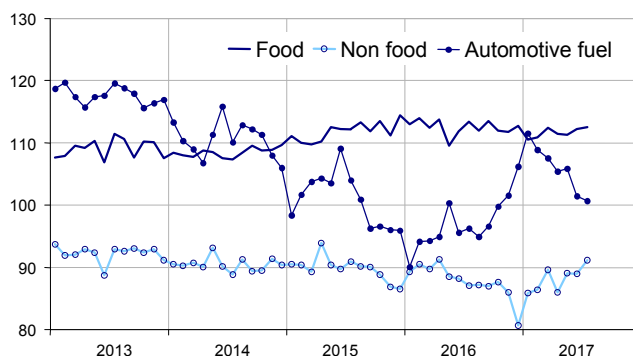
SA-WDA value, Base year 2010

Turnover in hypermarkets by type of products

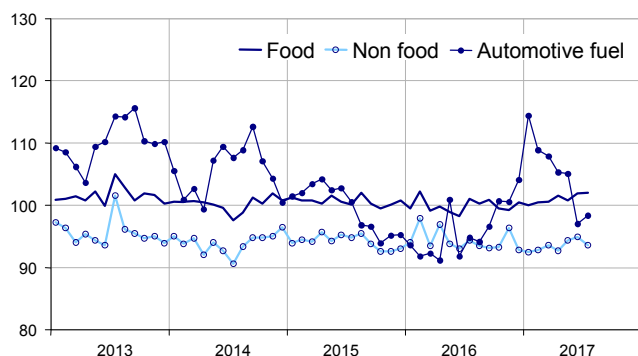

How to read it: within large scale food retailing, the SA-WDA variation between May and June 2017 is revised by -0.02 points: +0.17 points are due to the raw series' revision and -0.19 points to the new calculation of the SA-WDA.
